

Defenders of Mother Earth: Bandhoura Village Singrauli, Madhya Pradesh, India

The coal for Essar's <u>Mahan Super Thermal Power Project</u> was to be sourced from the Mahan forest. But local villagers joined forces against the clear-cut of hundreds of trees and formed the Mahan Sangharsh Samiti (MSS) in 2013. Advocate Madan Jaiswal helped the local women's struggle initially.
